Team Brooke and Kahsay recognize the challenges facing graduate and professional students, with inadequate stipends being a top concern. Many serve as lab researchers and assistant instructors, yet are undercompensated. We are committed to increasing these stipends and have engaged with administrators to implement changes in the 2025-2026 academic year.

We also understand the need for strong representation. We have helped increase graduate student senators in SGA and now we want to continue this work by collaborating with the Graduate Student Congress to ensure their voices are heard. Graduate students make up 23% of our university, yet many feel overlooked—we are dedicated to changing that.

Financial stability is another major concern. Tuition has risen by over \$10,000 in the past decade. We will advocate for reinstating a tuition cap, ensuring students pay a fixed rate throughout their four years. As Student Body President, I will use my vote on the Board of Trustees to push for this change.

To support student organizations, we will work to increase grants from \$2,000 to \$3,000, providing more resources for professional development and advocacy.

Our mission is simple: amplify graduate student voices, secure necessary funding, and make higher education more accessible. We are ready to take action.

McKenna Dowell & Jackson Baird

We are very passionate about meeting every student (undergraduate, graduate, professional, etc.) where they are at. This includes parking expansion and increased availability since most of our graduate and professional students reside off campus. We have met with the Director of Parking & Transportation at UK (Mr. Broeking) and collaborated to making a \$14 semester nightly parking pass. This essentially will be a nightly parking pass students can use when attending classes on campus (because we know most graduate and professional. Classes take place in the evenings). Also, we are building two new parking garages across this campus to expand availability for all students. Lastly, we are collaborating with UK Parking & Transportations Marketing team to create a interactive parking map so students can see where they can/cannot park across campus.

We are prideful athletic fans, and McKenna was previously a Student athlete on the STUNT team here at UK. We want to enhance the gameday experience for not just our current students but prospective students, alumni and our Lexington community at large. This can be done by hosting a university-led tailgate, something we have already discussed with UKAthletics. Additionally, we have met with the Director of Recreation (Mark Lattin) and associate dean of student success (Dr. Brandon Thompson) and have already been approved for funding and all other logistics to implement cold-plunges and saunas in the Johnson Center by Fall of 2026. McKenna travels to Frankfort for work twice a week for an internship. This is about 1.5 hours of driving a week- something most students also have to face to work to afford their rent, tuition, dues, etc. We would love to start a grant students who travel for work for can apply to cover their gas costs.

We are so passionate about serving students and have other things we plan on implementing if elected such as mental health excuses absences, infrastructure improvement, and collaborating with alumni for internships/clerkships/shadowing and all professional development experience. We would love to hear your thoughts/ideas/concerns/ambitions/etc and what ways we can serve students in all capacities.
