Funding Opportunities for Registered Student Organizations

- Funding Applications: Registered Student Organizations (RSOs) can now submit funding applications through BBNvolved.
- Multiple Grant Opportunities: Organizations are welcome to apply for more than one grant to support a range of activities or initiatives.
- Funding Limit: The maximum total funding available per organization is \$2,000 per fiscal year.
- Terms and Conditions: Detailed guidelines, eligibility criteria, and funding requirements are available on BBNvolved. All applicants are encouraged to review these carefully before submitting.
- During the discussion, several members suggested exploring individual funding opportunities for graduate students, particularly in the form of academic or professional development resources (e.g., Bar Exam preparation support)
- A question was also raised about whether a portion of SGA funding could be specifically allocated to graduate student organizations to minimize competition with undergraduate groups.

Response: It was clarified that the current budget provides sufficient funding for all student organizations, and therefore no separate allocation is necessary at this time. All organizations, graduate and undergraduate alike, are encouraged to apply early, as funds are distributed on a first-come, first-served basis.

- Funding Update
- Conference and travel awards, including those intended for individual students and the Graduate and Professional Student Organization (GPSO), will not be offered this year. Another reason was that GSC is not an academic unit so would not be able to disburse such funds.
 - This decision is based on recent changes in government policies, particularly those emphasizing viewpoint neutrality.
 - ❖ Additionally, since the Graduate Student Council (GSC) is not classified as an academic unit, it does not have the authority to disburse funds for such individual awards.

ii. Decision on Funds reallocation

- Voting Process
- The General Assembly held a vote to determine how the available funds should be reallocated, prioritizing initiatives that most directly benefit the graduate student community.

Voting Result (highest to lowest):

- 1. Material resources supporting basic needs. Examples include hosting more events that provide essential supplies, food, and giveaways for graduate students.
- 2. Material resources supporting professional development (e.g., poster printing services and other tools that facilitate academic and career growth)
- 3. Leadership and campus engagement activities, such as opportunities that encourage student leadership and participation in campus-wide initiatives.

Note: Items #2 and #3 received equal priority votes, resulting in a tie for second place


